Our summer work teams are still somewhat in limbo, contingent upon when the State lifts the 14 day quarantine on travelers from outside the State. the villages via Zoom and Facetime.

Last summer when Beth and I were in Chignik Lagoon for VBS, the ladies there expressed to my wife Beth that they wanted to have a ladies' meeting, learn the Word of God and be strengthened in the faith. God is now giving them the desires of their hearts. Over the past couple of months, Cate (one of our AVM Board members), has led a weekly Bible study with the ladies there by means

of Facetime. Not only are they being taught the truth, their hearts are hungry for the Word of God.

On Easter Sunday, we held a church service in Chignik Lagoon by means of Zoom. It was wonderful. We had about 15 people there, and the women were thrilled that the men came! Cate brought a resurrection message from the Word of God and led in worship. Beth led in communion, and I was able to lead the people of God in prayer.

In the village of Port Graham, we have been averaging 8-12 people per Sunday by means of Zoom. Terry and Lara, new school teachers in the village, have brought a lot of life to the church family. This week, Lara led worship, I (Duane) preached and Beth guided us in communion. Plus Lara is leading an adult Bible Study on Wednesday nights that the congregation has really enjoyed.

Lastly, in the spring of 2016 we took on the assignment of stepping in for Ray Arno as he began his retirement. When Ray asked us if we would take his place, my first thought was that we don't have 50 years to give like Ray did (we are both 68). But we felt the Lord was directing us to make a five year commitment to AVM. We assumed that a big part of our role would be to facilitate the transition from Ray's leadership to someone younger, with more years than us to invest in the ministry. This spring is the beginning of our fifth year at AVM, and we feel that the transition phase has gone well and that AVM is ready for someone younger to guide the way into the future. We have informed our Board that this will be our last year, so they will be seeking the Lord over this next year about who the new leader will be.
